Philosophy:

The art and activity of marching is one that combines quality music with an effective visual presentation. Through consistent and positive instruction, it is the goal of the staff to provide our students and audiences with both a highly competitive and entertaining marching band/winter guard shows. We want to teach students that want and are willing to learn. It takes all of us to work together for the Smithson Valley High School Band and Color Guard.

Goals and Purpose:

The goal of the Smithson Valley High School Color Guard is to provide an opportunity for the students to participate in representing their school. The Color Guard is a group that teaches teamwork, performance skills, and builds confidence and self-esteem.

Teamwork and group activities require that an individual put aside their personal feelings for the good of the group. What is required of one is required for all. When each individual is willing to give up a small part of himself/herself, the group benefits tremendously. Personal sacrifice and understanding the dynamics of a team will be crucial to becoming the best color guard member possible.

Most importantly, membership in Smithson Valley High School Color Guard is a PRIVILEGE not a right.

Rehearsal and Performance:

Students are required to dress out appropriately every day. Tennis shoes or guard shoes are required for every rehearsal. In Marching Season, we will experience a wide variety of weather conditions throughout the season, so it is your responsibility to be prepared.

Students shall come to all rehearsal with WATER in Camelback. Ample breaks for water will be given throughout each rehearsal.

It is important to note that marching band, by nature, is a physical activity. There is a great demand placed on students to be able to march and perform a complete show. It is the belief of the staff that there should be proper conditioning on the part of the student in order to facilitate a strong, personal performance and to minimize/avoid injury. Calisthenics, stretching and muscle training may be advocated and reinforced as well. Individual preparation is the responsibility of each member. Students must wear hair pulled back and NO jewelry.

Color Guard Class Expectations:

- Development of individual basics including flag, rifle and saber skills and techniques.
-
- Development of basic movement and dance skills and techniques.
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- Development of skills including timing of equipment and body movement.
-
- Development of marching skills and techniques.
-
- Full participation in all Color Guard and Marching Band activities including class, rehearsals, parades, pep rallies, football games, winter guard and marching contest, etc.
- As we get into the rehearsals for the season, etiquette for various types of rehearsals will be clearly defined by the staff. It is expected that all members will adhere to the defined procedures.

Should a student demonstrate on a regular basis that he or she does not subscribe to the proper conduct at a rehearsal, the director reserves the right to evaluate the student's performance and decide as to whether the student should perform in upcoming shows. The director also reserves the right to send a student home from rehearsal and request a parent/student conference to determine future course of action.

It is very important that all members of the guard understand that rehearsal is not the time to socialize. When the guard is not collectively rehearsing or setting drill, each member should be independently working on the show's routine.

Conduct and Rehearsal Guidelines:

- All students must follow the guidelines in the CISD Student Handbook, CISD Code of Conduct and the Smithson Valley High School Band/Color Guard Handbooks.
- Students should show proper respect to ALL Director, whether it be the Color Guard Director, Band Director, Color Guard/Marching Technicians, or any student in a leadership position.
- Any negative or disrespectful response to a Director or Leader will result in disciplinary action.
- Disorderly behavior and abusive language, including profanity, racial slurs, sexual harassment, etc. will not be tolerated and will result in disciplinary action.
- Students are expected to arrive at rehearsal 15 minutes prior to the beginning of rehearsal.
- Lateness will not be tolerated. If a student is to be late, a note will be required from teacher or parent.
- Missing rehearsal is not tolerated. If a student must miss a rehearsal due to unavoidable situation, the student is required to notify the Color Guard 48 hours in advance with a phone call and written note from a parent. The student must report directly to the Director, telling another student instead will NOT suffice.
- Constant tardiness or absences from rehearsal may result in the permanent removal of the student's performance spot.
- Any student who does not choose to comply with these guidelines may be removed from the program.
- **It is the goal of the teachers and staff to provide a teaching atmosphere that is both positive and effective.**

Color Guard Room and Locker Room:

These rooms are to be used exclusively for the storage of color guard equipment and supplies that are used for color guard rehearsals.

The following are guidelines that need to be followed with the use of these rooms.

1. Students are expected to keep the Color Guard Room and Locker Room neat and clean at all times.
2. Do Not Eat or Drink (only WATER) in any of these rooms, including the Band Hall.
3. At no time should a student who is not a Color Guard member be in the equipment/locker room.
4. At no time should a student who is not a Color Guard member handle the equipment (flag, rifle, saber, etc.)

Color Guard:

Color Guard is an athletic activity. Students need to be dressed out and in appropriate attire every day during class. Athletic clothing should be worn (NO JEANS OR SANDALS WILL BE ALLOWED.) It is impossible for you to fully participate in the activity when you are not dressed appropriately. Remember that Color Guard counts as a PE credit each Fall semester.

Grading Procedures:

Grades are earned on the basis of participation and stylistic achievement. The percentages have been broken down into the following categories.

1. Participation/Rehearsals (Daily Grade Equivalent) =20%
2. Fundamental Skills Evaluation (Quiz Grade Equivalent) =35%
3. Marching Show Routine Pass-Off/Performance (Major Grade Equivalent) =45%

Other Basic Expectations

- If a returning member has an outstanding balance from the previous year, he or she cannot audition for the Smithson Valley High School Color Guard.
- Yearly Band/Color Guard calendar available on Smithson Valley HS Band website (svrangerband.org) to plan.
- Dress appropriately for rehearsals.
- Fingernails must be kept short to avoid injury.
- Hair should be a natural color and not distracting to the educational or performance atmosphere.
- Cell phone will be turned off and placed in your bag while in rehearsal.
- A "Thank You" " Yes Sir or Yes Ma'am" is appropriate after every correction.
- Be respectful.
- Raise your hand for permission to speak.
- Allow students leaders to do their job.
- Take care of, store properly and be responsible for your own equipment.
- Always have your ride home ready/waiting to pick you up after rehearsals and performances.
- Student jobs are **NOT** reason for an excused absence from Band/Color Guard rehearsal or performance.
- Remember Monday/Tuesday Night rehearsals from 6-8p.m. (We would be glad to talk to employers to validate student's commitment anytime for you.)
- If a member of the SVHS Band/Color Guard leaves the program for discipline reasons or otherwise he or she cannot return to the program.
- SVCG Lettermen's Jacket Rules are the same as the SVHS Band members- Rules are listed in the SVHS Band Handbook. **1.)** The Student must have completed 3 years/6 semesters to be measured the end of their Junior year to earn a Jacket for their Senior year. The students must be in 4 years of SV Color Guard/Winter Guard. If you choose not to participate in the SVHS Band /Color Guard Program your Senior year you will not receive a jacket. (Move-ins will still be eligible when they are seniors) **2.)** Be a performing member in the full SVHS Varsity Winter Guard season by the NOVEMBER/DECEMBER AUDITION.

If a Band/Color Guard student has an unexcused absence from a performance/rehearsal, they are subject to immediate removal from the Band/Color Guard Program.

A MESSAGE FROM THE COMAL ISD SPORTS MEDICINE DEPARTMENTS

Comal Independent School District employs 10 full-time staff Athletic Trainers that work with athletes at the 5 high schools and part-time Athletic Trainers who work with our 7 middle schools. Athletic Trainers (ATs) are health care professionals who collaborate with physicians. The services provided by Athletic Trainers comprise injury/illness prevention, emergency care, clinical evaluation and diagnosis, therapeutic intervention, and rehabilitation of injuries and medical conditions. Staff athletic trainers work closely with team physicians, other physicians in the community, coaches, and parents to ensure the health-care needs of the injured athletes are being met.

PRE-PARTICIPATION PHYSICAL EXAMS

The University Interscholastic League requires that student athletes have documentation on file each year that includes a medical history, acknowledgement of rules and risk of concussion and/or sudden cardiac arrest, a steroid testing agreement, and permission to participate in UIL activities. As a minimum requirement, the Pre-participation Physical Examination completed by a physician must be completed prior to junior high athletic participation and again prior to the first and third years of high school athletic participation.

Comal ISD recognizes that the pre-participation physical examination (PPE) is an important requirement in any organized program and should be performed by the athlete's primary care physician or school/team physician **ANNUALLY**. Comal ISD believes that going beyond the UIL minimum requirement is imperative as health conditions may change from year to year and the development of subtle problems may be overlooked. On the PPE form, the parent/guardian is required to reveal pertinent medical history. During the physical examination, the physician will go over the medical history and should educate the athlete about their individual health risks.

PPEs for the 2021-2022 school year will not be accepted if physical is dated prior to April 1, 2021.

Comal ISD believes that each child should establish a primary care physician and utilize that physician for their PPE. At the same time, we understand that due to circumstances, an option for athletes to obtain a less costly PPE is necessary. For that reason, Comal ISD offers "Physical Days" in which Comal ISD athletes may obtain a pre-participation physical examination. Please check with your respective high school for date and time of these physicals

Important Note: If your child has a previous medical/orthopedic condition, takes medication, or checks off >4 questions as a "yes" in the medical history portion of the paperwork, we encourage them to be seen by their primary care physician.

STANDARDS OF BEHAVIOR AND OFF CAMPUS TRAVEL POLICIES

Membership in the Smithson Valley HS Band is an honor and a privilege. Participation comes with a higher standard of behavior than the Comal ISD Student Code of Conduct and may condition membership or participation on adherence to those standards.

Extracurricular standards of behavior may take into consideration conduct that occurs at any time, on or off school property.

Extracurricular behavioral standards shall not have the effect of discriminating on the basis of gender, race, color, disability, religion, ethnicity or national origin. Student's and parent's signature acknowledge they have read these behavioral standards and consent to them as a condition of participation in Smithson Valley HS Band.

Students who represent the Smithson Valley HS Band are expected to maintain very high standards in every respect at all times. They are expected to attend and be on time for all sessions and activities scheduled. In the event of overnight trips, they are expected to be in their rooms at the times designated by their sponsors. Each student will be responsible to one or more faculty sponsors who will supervise the activities of the student for the trip. Negligence in attending sessions, in meeting curfew requirements, or in failing to maintain our standards of conduct may make it necessary for the sponsor to send the student home at his/her own expense. Video/audio equipment is used for safety purposes to monitor student behavior on buses and campuses. Recordings shall be reviewed as needed by the principal, and evidence of student misconduct shall be documented.

Self-discipline is the key element when representing Smithson Valley HS and Comal ISD off campus or when on a school-related trip. Students who are involved in a serious disciplinary offense, such as the use, possession of, or being under the influence of illicit drugs, tobacco, or alcohol, stealing, violence, going in the room of a member of the opposite sex, or some other serious offense will face disciplinary action which may include one or more of the following:

1. The student will be sent home from the trip at the parents' expense.
2. The student will be held liable for damages to property.
3. The student may be removed from this school activity as well as other school co-curricular activities.
4. The student may be placed in In-School-Suspension (ISS), Off-Campus-Suspension, or Alternative Education Placement.

Student's attire during school activities outside the school day should be in good taste. While it is inevitable there will be differences of opinion regarding the appropriateness of a student's attire, the final decision lies with the directors. All adults on trips will serve as sponsors when traveling with a group. Students will be expected to treat them with respect at all times.

REMEMBER – Even though you will not always be wearing a shirt with a Smithson Valley logo, people will find out where you are from and what group you represent. You have the opportunity to make a tremendous name for Smithson Valley and for yourself. Be courteous and polite at all times. There is no way we can anticipate every possible scenario, so we ask for good judgment. Please use common sense. RULE OF THUMB: If there is any question in your mind as to whether you should do something or not...DON'T DO IT! It is better to be safe than sorry.

WE ARE CONFIDENT OF ALL SMITHSON VALLEY HS BAND STUDENTS' CONDUCT AND THEIR ABILITY TO BE GOOD AMBASSADORS FOR COMAL ISD. IF WE ANTICIPATED A PROBLEM, WE WOULD NOT TRAVEL.

PARENT/STUDENT UIL MARCHING BAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT FORM

No student may be required to attend practice for marching band for more than eight hours of rehearsal outside the academic school day per calendar week (Sunday through Saturday). This provision applies to students in all components of the marching band.

On performance days (football games, competitions and other public performances) bands may hold up to one additional hour of warm-up and practice beyond the scheduled warm-up time at the performance site. Multiple performances on the same day do not allow for additional practice and/or warm-up time.

- Marching Band Rehearsal (Both Full Band And Components)
- Any Marching Band Group Instructional Activity
- Breaks
- Announcements
- Debriefing And Viewing Marching Band Videos
- Playing Off Marching Band Music
- Marching Band Sectionals (Both Director And Student Led)
- Clinics For The Marching Band Or Any Of Its Components

The Following Activities Are Not Included In The Eight Hour Time Allotment:

- Travel Time To And From Rehearsals And/Or Performances
- Rehearsal Set-Up Time
- Pep Rallies, Parades And Other Public Performances
- Instruction And Practice For Music Activities Other Than Marching Band And Its Components

EXPLANATION OF BAND FEES

FAIR SHARE:

This amount covers the cost of incidentals throughout the year. Examples of incidentals include gloves, band contest fees, marching show expenses (music, drill, consultants, etc.), water, end of year concert uniform dry cleaning, MusicFirst subscriptions, clinician costs, and band social functions.

UNIFORM:

This is a custom designed uniform that has been created specifically for our Competitive 2021 UIL Production: "Unsustainable".

COLOR GUARD T-SHIRT:

Color Guard T-shirts are part of the main Ranger Color Guard uniform and will be worn while the contest uniform is not being worn for events such as pep-rallies, contest trips, recruitment, ect.

SUMMER UNIFORM:

The "summer uniform" will consist of our new polo shirt, blue jeans of your choice, black socks, black belt, earrings, and black jazz shoes. We will purchase your polo with your \$30.00 fee and earrings with your \$12 fee. While we are transitioning to this, if returning members would like to wear the past traditional uniform, they can. If they choose so, full past traditional uniform is required. Replacement parts for past traditional uniform will not be provided, if needed, you will need to purchase the new CG polo.

CAMELBAK:

This is required equipment at all rehearsals and performances, and is for all freshmen and anyone who needs a new one. The Camelbaks we use are all black and considered part of our uniform, so they must all look the same. We order in bulk in order to pass down a 30% discount over retail.

JAZZ SHOES:

We will be using the same style of jazz shoe as last year. These shoes are specifically designed for Color Guard/Dance to make sure students have maximum mobility while keep a slim shape to them. This is a required part of the summer uniform, as well as the Color Guard uniform.

PRE-GAME MEALS:

Football games go late and it is critical that students receive a good meal before game time. Parents have the option of providing this meal, however the Booster Club offers pre-game meals as a convenience, providing meals before each regular season game at \$8.00 per meal. For logistical reasons, pre-game meals are only offered as a *package* for the season and cannot be ordered “a la carte.” Vegetarian options are available.

BOOSTER MEMBERSHIP:

Support the Band and Color Guard at SVHS by becoming a Booster Member! Your tax deductible contribution will help offset the costs of the Fall Marching Show. Membership includes a vote at booster meetings, as well as a Ranger Band car decal.

SENIOR BANNER:

Senior banners are presented at the Senior Night football game on September 3rd.

SAUSAGE WRAP PRE-ORDER: Pre-order Sausage Wrap Dinner/Silent Auction tickets for your family! Tickets are \$10 each and this year’s event will be held on Friday, October 1st. ****Student tickets are included in the mandatory fees, so this is only a pre-order for family members.****

MEET THE BAND MEAL:

Sausage wraps + chips and a drink are offered at this performance on August 19th. Pre-order as many as you would like for \$7.00 each.

SPIRIT BOOTH MERCHANDISE:

This is your chance to order *all kinds* of Ranger gear in preparation for football games, band contests, etc., etc.

While Ranger Color Guard fees are between 50% to 80% less than other programs in our area, we understand that it is still a significant investment, particularly for families who have multiple students in the program.
